Given our Advent theme, I felt moved to share this excerpt from Kevin Clements' Conflict Analysis and Resolution—as offered by Jerry Barrett many years ago in a NOVA newsletter. These words have been a much appreciated touchstone for me ever since.

Symptoms of Inner Peace

Be on the lookout for symptoms of inner peace! The hearts of a great many have already been exposed to inner peace and it is possible that people everywhere could come down with it in epidemic proportions. This could pose a serious threat to what has up to now been a fairly stable condition of conflict in the world.

Some signs to look for:

- a tendency to think and act spontaneously rather than on fears based on past experiences
- an unmistakable ability to enjoy each moment
- a loss of interest in judging other people
- · a loss of interest in interpreting the actions of others
- a loss of interest in conflict
- a loss of the ability to worry (This is a very serious symptom!)
- frequent, overwhelming episodes of appreciation
- an increasing tendency to let things happen rather than make them happen
- an increased susceptibility to the love offered by others as well as the uncontrollable urge to extend it.
